

DISASTER FOOD STAMPS:

What Immigrant Families Should Know



The State of North Carolina has authorized disaster food stamps (D-SNAP) for families who have been affected by Hurricane Helene to receive money to purchase food.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- You must be from one of the following counties: Alexander, Alleghany, Ashe, Avery, Buncombe, Burke, Caldwell, Catawba, Clay, Cleveland, Gaston, Haywood, Henderson, Jackson, Lincoln, Macon, Madison, McDowell, Mitchell, Polk, Rutherford, Transylvania, Watauga, Wilkes or Yancey, or be a member of the Eastern Band of the Cherokee Indians living in zip code 28719.
- You must have suffered some loss of food due to the disaster (for example, food in the refrigerator was spoiled), AND suffered some loss from the hurricane, including:
 - Suffered damage or destruction of your home due to the hurricane.
 - Suffered loss of self-employment due to the hurricane,
 - Suffered lost income, including loss of a job in one of the impacted counties,
 - You cannot access your money, such as your bank account, or
 - Suffered other disaster-related expenses that will not be reimbursed by another source (such as FEMA) before October 24, 2024.
- Immigrants are eligible regardless of status, or with no status at all:
 - Any immigrant may apply, including H-2A and H-2B visa holders, other temporary immigrants,

- or even undocumented immigrants with no status at all
- The application may ask for a social security number, but you are **not required to fill it in.** If you do not have a SSN, simply leave the box blank. Never fill in false information on a benefit application.
- Information on SNAP applications is confidential and is not shared with ICE/Immigration.
- Applicants must verify their identity. According to the DSS rules, "this can be in the form of a picture ID or any other form of identification. This proof may include, but is not limited to, Social Security card, mail, or ...statement."
- Using D-SNAP or any disaster benefit has no impact on your ability to get a green card in the future.
- Your income must be below certain limits.
- Different types of households can be eligible:
 - This includes families who live together and prepare meals together.
 - It also includes unrelated adults who live together (such as farmworkers in a migrant camp). If you state that you will be preparing meals independently of your roommates or housemates, you can apply as an individual.
- You are NOT eligible if you are <u>already receiving food</u> <u>stamps.</u>

*** YOU MUST APPLY FOR DISASTER FOOD STAMPS ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 24, 2024 ***

- Apply by Phone: Apply by calling the **D-SNAP call center at 1-844-453-1117.** The D-SNAP call center will be open weekdays beginning on October 18 from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, and Saturday, Oct. 19 and Sunday, Oct. 20 from 9:00 am to noon.
- Apply In-Person: Apply for D-SNAP in-person at any of locations listed at <u>ncdhhs.gov/dsnap</u>. The D-SNAP application sites will be open weekdays beginning on October 18 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., and Saturday, Oct. 19 and Sunday, Oct. 20 from 9:00 am to 2:00 p.m.
- **Note:** Residents are encouraged to apply in their county of residence, but they can also apply in person at **any** of the locations listed at **ncdhhs.gov/dsnap**.
- You may also pre-register online here beginning on October 15, 2024, but it is not required.
